Our National Conference is now less than three months away. This year it is being held in Hobart at the Grand Chancellor Hotel. The President Elect and Conference Chair, Mr Stephen Norris writes in more detail of the Conference below. At the Annual General Meeting, to be held on Friday 12 August, the Management Committee is proposing a change to the Network's name. We propose the new name of *Anglican Schools Australia*, to replace the Australian Anglican Schools Network. The Management Committee believes that the proposed name is more 'user-friendly' and better positions the Network for recognition at the national level. We remain a Network of General Synod....only the name changes. This Matter will come before the AGM for consideration.
